

And although we have deserved Thy righteous wrath and manifold punishments, yet, we entreat Thee, O most merciful Father, remember not the sins of our youth nor our many transgressions, but out of Thine unspeakable goodness, grace,

and mercy defend us from all harm and danger of body and soul. Preserve us from false and pernicious doctrine, from war and bloodshed, from plague and pestilence, from all calamity by fire and water, from hail and tempest, from failure of harvest and from famine, from anguish of heart and despair of Thy mercy, and from an evil death. And in every time of trouble show Thyself a very present Help, the Savior of all men, and especially of them that believe.

Cause all needful fruits of the earth to prosper, that we may enjoy them in due season. Give success to the Christian training of the young, to all lawful occupations on land and sea, and to all pure arts and useful knowledge; and crown them with Thy blessing.

Receive, O God, our bodies and souls and all our talents, together with the offerings we bring before Thee, for Thou hast purchased us to be Thine own, that we may live unto Thee.

Dearly Beloved: Forasmuch as we purpose to come to the Holy Supper of our Lord Jesus Christ, it becometh us diligently to examine ourselves, as St. Paul exhorteth us. For this holy Sacrament hath been instituted for the special comfort and strengthening of those who humbly confess their sins and hunger and thirst after righteousness.

But if we thus examine ourselves, we shall find nothing in us but sin and death, from which we can in no wise set ourselves free. Verily, you should so believe, for Holy Scripture declares: God so loved the world that He gave His only-begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

4. Do you promise that with the aid of the Holy Ghost you will henceforth amend your sinful life? Then declare so by saying: I do promise.

Verily, you should so promise, for Christ, the Lord, says: Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father which is in heaven.

5. Finally, do you believe that through me, a called servant declare so by saying: I do believe.

As you believe, even so may it be unto you.

Upon this your confession, I, by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God unto all of you, and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost.

So the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Ghost is God. Similar

And yet they are not three Gods, but one God.

So likewise the Father is Lord, the Son Lord, and the Holy Ghost Lord.

And yet not three Lords, but one Lord.

For like as we are compelled by the Christian verity to acknowledge every Person by Himself to be God and Lord,

So are we forbidden by the catholic religion to say, There be three Gods or three Lords.

The Father is made of none, neither created nor begotten.

The Son is of the Father alone, not made nor created, but begotten.

The Holy Ghost is of the Father and of the Son, neither made nor created nor begotten, but proceeding.

So there is one Father, not three Fathers: one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Ghost, not three Holy Ghosts.

And in this Trinity none is before or after other; none is greater or less than another;

But the whole three Persons are coeternal together and coequal, so that in all things, as is aforesaid, the Unity in Trinity and the Trinity in Unity is to be worshiped.

He, therefore, that will be saved must thus think of the Trinity.

Furthermore, it is necessary to everlasting salvation that he also believe faithfully the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.

For the right faith is that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is God and Man;

God of the Substance of the Father, begotten before the worlds; and Man of the substance of His mother, born in the world;

Perfect God and perfect Man, of a reasonable soul and human flesh subsisting.

Equal to the Father, as touching His Godhead and inferior to the Father as touching His manhood;

Who, although He be God and Man, yet He is not two, but

one Christ: One, not by conversion of the Godhead into flesh, but by taking the manhood into God;

One altogether; not by confusion of Substance, but by unity

For as the reasonable soul and flesh is one man, so God and Man is one Christ;

Who suffered for our salvation; descended into hell; rose again the third day from the dead;

He ascended into heaven; He sitteth on the right hand of the Father, God Almighty; from whence He shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

At whose coming all men shall rise again with their bodies and shall give an account of their own works.

And they that have done good shall go into life everlasting; and they that have done evil, into everlasting fire.

This is the catholic faith; which except a man believe faithfully and firmly, he cannot be saved.

O Lord Jesus Christ, Thou only Shepherd and Bishop of our souls, who didst suffer for us and didst bear our sins in Thine own body on the tree, we give Thee hearty thanks for all Thy goodness and mercy, and most humbly beseech Thee to grant that with Thy stripes we may be healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; but do Thou turn us again to Thee and impart Thy grace to us, that, being dead to sins, we may live unto righteousness, and evermore serve Thee, who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end.

O THOU FAITHFUL SAVIOR, who of Thine infinite love didst condescend to walk the way of the cross and to atone for the sin of all mankind, we beseech Thee, give us grace to remember always in true faith what Thou hast done for us; give us also willingness and strength to follow Thee upon the way that leads through the thorns of sufferings and griefs to eternal happiness, and be our Guide through the dark valley of the shadow of death. 

The Invitatory varies with the Season and is always used with Psalm 95 at Matins. It is divided into two parts, separated by a colon. The first part, or the whole, of the Invitatory may be sung or said by the Minister or sung by a single voice or by the choir before the Psalm; after the Psalm and Gloria Patri the whole Invitatory shall be sung.

An Antiphon is used at Matins and Vespers with the Psalms, the Magnificat, the Nunc Dimittis, and the Benedictus. It is used in the same manner as the Invitatory.

The Responsory varies with the Season and may be sung after the last Lesson at Vespers and Matins. At the end of the Responsory is sung Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost (but not "As it was in the beginning," etc.), followed by the repetition of the last sentence of the Responsory.

A Versicle may be used at Vespers after the Hymn and at Vespers and Matins before the closing Collect. A Versicle is used before the Litany Collects. The first part of the Versicle is said by the Minister and the second part sung or said by the people.

Amen.

LET Us PRAY for our Catechumens, that our Lord God would open their hearts and the door of His mercy, that, having received the remission of all their sins by the washing of regeneration, they may be mindful of their baptismal covenant and evermore be found in Christ Jesus, our Lord:

Almighty and everlasting God, who dost always multiply Thy Church and with Thy light and grace dost strengthen the hearts of those whom Thou hast regenerated, confirming unto them Thy of those whom faithfulness, grant unto our Catechumens increase covenant and faithfulness, grant unto our Catechumens increase to faith and knowledge that they may rejoice in their Bapboth of faith and heartily renew their covenant with Thee.

LET Us PRAY our Lord God Almighty that He would LET US PRAI out all error, take away disease, ward off deliver the world from all error, take away disease, ward off deliver the world from set free those in bondage, grant a safe famine, open the prisons, set free those in bondage, grant a safe famine, open the pittolio, health to the sick, and to our mariners return to the wayfarers, health to the sick, and to our mariners a harbor of security:

Almighty and everlasting God, the Consolation of the sorrowful and the Strength of the weak, may the prayers of them that in any tribulation or distress cry unto Thee graciously come before Thee, so that in all their necessities they may mark and receive Thy manifold help and comfort; through Christ, our Lord.

Have mercy upon us, we beseech Thee, and turn not Thy countenance from us. According to the multitude of Thy tender mercies blot out our transgressions. Wash us thoroughly from our iniquity and cleanse us from our sins; enable us by Thy Holy Spirit to serve Thee with a better life; through the merits and mediation of Thy Son Jesus Christ, our Lord.

LET Us PRAY for all in authority:

Almighty and everlasting God, we beseech Thee graciously to regard * the President of the United States, his counselors,

and all others to whom Thou hast committed the government of our nation; guide them by Thy Holy Spirit in these trying times. Grant that they may be high in purpose, wise in counsel, unwavering in duty. Touch their hearts with the keen and mighty sword of Thy Word, that, fostering what is right and following what is true, they may obey Thy holy will, uphold the honor of our nation, secure the protection of our people, and fulfill Thy divine purpose; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

LET US PRAY for all those in the armed service of our nation:

O Lord God Almighty, whose arm is powerful to defend and protect all that put their trust in Thee, we commend to Thy fatherly care the men who are bearing arms in the defense of our country at home and abroad. We pray Thee, keep them under the shadow of Thy wings; be Thou their Strength in all danger, in distress, and in temptations. Give them courage, boldness, and faithfulness in the performance of their duty. In life and death may they put their trust in Thee, who art the only Giver of victory; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

LET Us PRAY for the sick, the imprisoned, the wounded, the dying, whether our own or of the enemy, and for all who minister to them:

Uphold with Thy grace and power all those who are ministering to the sick and wounded, the imprisoned, and the dying; fill the hearts of Thy ministers of the Gospel with a deep devotion and love; grant to the physicians and surgeons wisdom and skill and to the nurses sympathy and patience; protect them and bless them in all dangers, anxieties, and labors. All this we ask through the merits and mediation of Thy Son Jesus Christ, our Lord.

LET Us PRAY for all who are anxious and troubled:

Almighty and most merciful God, the Consolation of the troubled and the Hope of all who cast their cares on Thee, may the hearts that cry unto Thee in their anxiety, distress, and tribulation find rest in Thy grace and mercy, knowing that all things must work together for good to them that love Thee. Grant unto us all that peace which passeth understanding, so that with a quiet mind we may view the storms and troubles of life, the cloud and the thick darkness, ever rejoicing to know that the darkness and the light are both alike to Thee; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

LET Us PRAY for those engaged in warfare against us:

O Lord God Almighty, Ruler and Governor of all things, who stillest the roarings of the deep and the unrest of nations, who makest wars to cease unto the end of the earth, breakest the bow, cuttest the spear in sunder, and burnest the chariot in the fire, protect Thy Church and all the members of the household of faith wherever they may be. Scatter the counsel of them that devise mischief against our nation, cause their plans to be confounded, and bring their dealings to naught. Disperse the people that love war; cast down the unjust from high places; put down all envious and malicious passions, so that peace may again have rest before Thee, and that all nations may freely serve Thee;

LET Us PRAY that a just peace may follow the present conflict and that the work of the Church may go forward:

Lord God, heavenly Father, who art the very God of peace, abate the pride, check the malice, and confound the devices of all who are not lovers of peace. Arise and with Thy good right

hand help all the oppressed and miserable of the earth. Grant grace that the dissensions and bitternesses that now prevail may finally be put aside, and set thereon the seal of permanence and of blessing that Thy Word may again have free course everywhere and that the vineyard which Thou hast planted among the nations may flourish. Give peace in our time, O God; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

LET US PRAY unto God for future mercies:

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, as we look to Thee for future mercies, we offer Thee our praise and thanksgiving for Thy goodness and loving-kindness toward us in the past: for the many favors showered upon our land, for the freedoms we have so long enjoyed, for the present unity among our people in this time of national danger, for the courage and loyalty of our men in the armed service of our country, and for many other unmerited blessings. We thank Thee above all for Thine inestimable love in the redemption of the world by our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, for the means of grace, and for the hope of glory. And we beseech Thee that we, and all those for whom we have now made our common supplications, may serve Thee in true faith and walk before Thee in holiness and righteousness all the days of our life; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end.

Our Father who art in heaven. Hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation. But deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

Or:

Everlasting and living God, the estate of matrimony ordained by Thee is a holy estate and is to be kept holy by us. We therefore pray Thee, anoint these betrothed persons with Thy Spirit, that they may enter into this estate in Thy name, continue in it to Thine honor and their own welfare, and conclude it, with Thy help, in joy and bliss. Even in life and death be Thou their God, for the sake of Jesus Christ, their Savior.

O most holy God, who art the Author of the marriage covenant and desirest us to keep it holy, we beseech Thee, behold with favor these Thy servants who intend to have their union sanctified by Thy Word. Do Thou consecrate and sanctify them, O God, that they may begin their wedded life with Thee; and grant them grace ever to remember with gladness that Thou hast united them. Enter into their hearts with Thy fear and into their home with Thy blessing. Hear us for Jesus' sake.

FOR THE SICK

Let Us Pray for our brother (sister) —— for whom, in his sickness, our intercession is desired:

Grant to the lifeless body rest in the bosom of the earth and hereafter, together with us all, a joyful resurrection to life everlasting. Teach us all to number our days, that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom and finally be saved; through Jesus Christ, Thy beloved Son, our Lord and Savior.

FOR A YOUNG CHILD

Graciously save and defend our country and its people, our Government, and the whole Christian Church. Bless all honest labor, and give us our daily bread. Preserve us from sickness and famine and all other calamities. Visit the afflicted, the sick, and the dying with Thy heavenly consolation. Preserve unto us and our children Thy Word and Sacraments; guide us with Thy counsel; and afterwards receive us to glory in the land of eternal rest, where, with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven we shall laud and magnify Thy glorious name, evermore praising Thee and saying: Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost; as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end.

MISSIONS

O ALMIGHTY AND EVERLASTING GOD, who didst manifest Thy Son Jesus Christ to the Wise Men of the East, bringing them as the first fruits of the Gentiles into His kingdom, to receive from them praise and glory and adoration, we thank Thee that Thou hast made Thine only-begotten Son to be both the Glory of Thy people Israel and the Light to lighten the Gentiles, and hast prepared Thy salvation for all people.

O LORD JESUS CHRIST, Thou Author and Finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Thee didst endure the cross, despising the shame, we thank Thee for Thine unspeakable love, in that Thou hast not only procured for us rest by Thy sorrow and life by Thy death, but art pleased also to impart Thy saving health to us by the preaching of the Cross, the Word of Truth.

As Thou hast brought us to the beginning of another Lenten Season and we are about to meditate on the solemn mysteries of Thy holy Passion, we beseech Thee, by Thy Holy Spirit enlighten our understanding, and direct our will, that we may hear the story of Thy sufferings and death with our minds disengaged from all worldly distractions and bent solely upon contemplating in devout

reverence and for our own salvation the wonders of Thy love, which even the angels desire to look into. Enable us to realize both the enormity and the bitterness of our sins, for which Thou wast wounded, that we may repent of them, and the unfathomable depths of Thy grace, which, where sin abounded, doth much more abound, that we may be comforted.

Oh, that Thy image, O Man of Sorrows, were deeply graven upon our hearts to make them Thine! Give us the obedience of faith, that we may now and hereafter be partakers of Thy plenteous redemption. Kindle in us evermore such fervent longing for blessed communion with Thee in the Holy Supper that we may come often to Thy Table. Do Thou also, by Thy Holy Spirit, work in us true repentance and a lively and steadfast faith in Thy gracious promises, a sincere desire to be in perfect charity with all men, and the earnest purpose to amend our sinful lives, that we may be meet and worthy partakers of the Holy Sacrament and, with full pardon of our past sins, be quickened in the way of righteousness, and that we may serve Thee in holiness and pureness of living, and give Thee continual thanks for all Thy goodness.

May Thy Holy Supper be a source of comfort to the penitent, a means of enrichment to the poor in spirit, to the sick a sweet relief from the bitterness of pain, and to the dying a pledge of their inheritance with the saints in light.

Abide in Thy Church with Thy gracious presence, and let her at all times be a faithful keeper and dispenser of the heavenly treasures entrusted to her for those who believe in Thee. Bless the right use of the means of grace wheresoever men keep the remembrance of Thy death, till Thou come.

Let Thy Word and Sacrament strengthen our souls during the days of our pilgrimage on earth, until hereafter we shall partake of Thy Supper with Thee in Thy Father's kingdom.

GOOD FRIDAY

O LORD JESUS CHRIST, Thou innocent Lamb of God, who wast led forth to the ignominious death of the cross for our sins and wast numbered with the transgressors, being made a curse for us to satisfy the eternal and inexorable justice of God, we give Thee most hearty praise, honor, and glory for Thine infinite mercy, and we beseech Thee to strengthen our faith and trust in Thee, that, being redeemed from the curse of the Law, we may comfort ourselves in every temptation with Thy all-sufficient merit. Let the preaching of the Cross be to us the power of God and the wisdom of God, that by the faithful use of Thy Word we may obtain the blessings which Thou hast promised.

Grant us Thy grace, that, as our old man is crucified with Thee, we may daily crucify our flesh and henceforth serve not sin, but walk in newness of life. May we also with true faith and sincere devotion follow Thy example of meekness in affliction and sorrow, love our enemies, and willingly suffer injury and injustice for Thy meekness' sake.

Draw us to Thee, as Thou didst draw the dying malefactor; intercede for us with Thy heavenly Father, as Thou didst pray for those who reviled and crucified Thee; and grant that we may continue blameless in steadfast faith and in patient hope unto the end. Remember us in Thy kingdom, let Thy cross be our solace in our final distress, and receive our souls into Thy hands; for Thou hast redeemed us, O Lord God of Truth.

O Lord Jesus Christ, we heartily thank Thee for Thy holy Passion and bitter death, for Thy sorrow and anguish of heart, for Thy pains and wounds, for all that Thou didst endure in body and soul. Thy soul was exceeding sorrowful even unto death. Thou gavest Thy back to the smiters, and Thy cheeks to them that plucked off the hair, and didst not hide Thy face from shame and spitting. Being numbered with the transgressors, Thou wast as a curse hanged on a tree; Thy hands and feet were pierced with nails; in Thy parching thirst they gave Thee vinegar and gall to drink; and even in Thy death men reviled Thee. Thou wast brought as a lamb to the slaughter; and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so Thou openedst not Thy mouth.

O Thou spotless Lamb of God, Thou didst bear our griefs and carry our sorrows, the Lord laid on Thee the iniquity of us all. In obedience to Thy heavenly Father, Thou didst, as our Surety, willingly lay down Thy life to render unto divine justice perfect satisfaction for sin, that, being clothed in the garment of Thy innocence, we might have pardon and peace. Therefore unto Thee, that didst love us and wash us from our sins in Thine own blood, be glory and dominion forever and ever.

O blessed Redeemer, we beseech Thee, let the remembrance of Thy bitter suffering and death be ever present to our souls. Teach us to acknowledge Thee as the one Sacrifice and only Atonement for sins, that we may turn from all false comforters and have true consolation by faith in Thee alone. May the contemplation of Thy cross subdue our evil impulses and arouse in us holy desires and aspirations, that, being dead to sins, we may live unto right-eousness. Teach us also to take up our cross and to endure in patient obedience all things for Thy name's sake. Let Thy cross be our comfort and strength in our last hour. May we by faith

overcome the terrors of death and joyfully commit our souls into Thy hands, that, having suffered with Thee, we may also be glorified with Thee, our Savior and Redeemer.

EASTER

O LORD JESUS CHRIST, Thou Sun of Righteousness, who camest forth from the dark night of death, in majesty surpassing the golden Easter dawn, rise also upon our hearts, and enable us to contemplate the glories of this sacred day, that we may praise and glorify Thee.

As our Surety Thou wast delivered up to death; but, behold, Thou livest. Thou hast conquered death and destroyed him that had the power of death, having bruised the head of the Serpent, the ancient Foe of God and man. Thou didst descend into the lower parts of the earth and hast spoiled principalities and powers and made a show of them openly.

Hail, Lion of the tribe of Judah! O Thou Conqueror of death and Captain of our salvation, the battle and the victory are Thine; but Thou dost share Thy conquest with us and dost clothe us with Thy triumph. Thou wast made the first fruits of them that sleep. Because Thou livest, we shall live also. And when Thou hadst overcome death, Thou didst open the Kingdom of Heaven for all believers. Thou, the true Paschal Lamb, which was offered for us, hast taken away the sin of the world and by Thy rising again hast restored to us innocence and everlasting life. Therefore we are glad and rejoice in Thy goodness, and we bless and praise Thy holy name.

O Thou Prince of Life, we beseech Thee, comfort us with the forgiveness of our sins, and abide continually with us, that in all our conflicts we may retain the Easter joy. Fulfill in us with power the work of faith; cause us to rise with Thee in true repent-

ance from our natural death of trespasses and sins and to put away the old leaven of malice and wickedness, that we may always walk with Thee and serve Thee in truth and in pureness of living. May Thy Spirit put into our minds holy desires and quicken us in all our duties, that through Thy power resting upon us we may overcome the world and the terrors of death, and at Thy coming to judge the world appear with Thee in glory, being like Thee, and having our bodies changed into the fashion of Thine own glorious body.

Bless Thine inheritance, O Lord; govern Thy people; lift them up forever. Defend and maintain Thy Church till the end of days. Give us shepherds who shall take heed unto themselves and to the whole flock; and let all pastors and teachers hold fast the form of sound words of faith and love which are in Christ Jesus.

Into Thy hands, O King of Kings and Lord of Lords, we commit our land and all civil authority everywhere. Endue all rulers and magistrates with wisdom and justice and the fear of Thy holy name, and let them punish wickedness and establish peace, that the righteous may flourish and Thy name be glorified.

Regard in compassion all who are oppressed by lawless might; all who are suffering for truth and for conscience' sake; all who are beset with temptations to sin; all who are sinking under the weight of disease; all who are ready to despair of Thy grace; all who are troubled by the fear of the grave; all who are entering into the valley of the shadow of death; and do Thou be in them the Hope of glory, and at Thy appearing may the trial of their faith be found unto Thy praise and honor.

Now unto Thee, who art able to keep us from falling and to present us faultless before the presence of Thy glory with exceeding joy, to the only wise God, our Savior, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and forever.

O ALMIGHTY, ETERNAL, AND MOST MERCIFUL GOD, the Father of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, we praise and bless Thee that of Thine infinite mercy Thou didst not spare Thine own Son, but didst deliver Him up for our offenses and raise Him again for our justification, making Him the first fruits of them that sleep.

O most faithful Savior Jesus Christ, we give thanks to Thee for Thy triumphant resurrection, whereby Thou hast abolished death and begotten us again to a lively hope, to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved for us in the heavens.

O God the Holy Ghost, we praise and glorify Thee that by Thy grace the blessed consolations of this sacred season are published to all Christian congregations, and that through Thy holy Word and Sacraments righteousness and salvation, the treasures of grace purchased and won for us by Christ, are imparted and confirmed to us.

O Holy Trinity, bless Thy Church, and cause the tidings of life to be told unto the ends of the earth. Comfort us evermore with the assurance that our transgressions are hid and sealed in the grave where our Redeemer lay, and that there is now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus and walk not after the flesh, but after the spirit. Withdraw our hearts from all earthly desires and affections, that as pilgrims and sojourners we may hasten forward to our inheritance of immortality in heaven. While we live, guide us with Thy counsel; and when we die, give us the crown of life, that with all the holy angels and the elect we may praise and glorify Thee, world without end.

O ALMIGHTY AND ETERNAL GOD, who through the death of Thy Son hast destroyed sin and death, and by His rising to life again restored innocence and everlasting life, that we, being delivered from the power of the devil, might live unto Thee in Thy kingdom, we beseech Thee to grant that we may evermore be comforted by true faith in the resurrection of Thy dear Son. Do Thou also, by the operation of Thy quickening Spirit, fulfill Thy work in us. that we live no more unto ourselves, but that Thou livest in us by Thy divine power, making us perfect in every good work to do Thy will, and working in us that which is well pleasing in Thy sight. Let not the thought of death fill our hearts with terror, but give us the blessed assurance that, like unto Christ, our Head, we shall not remain in our graves, but rise again at the end And when we have finished our course by Thy grace, may Thy resurrection be to our faith a sure pledge that an unfading inheritance is reserved for us in heaven. O Thou God of peace, who hast brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, the great Shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant, draw our souls and bodies at the last perfectly to Thee, that we may live with Thee and praise Thee, world without end.

O GRACIOUS LORD JESUS CHRIST, honor and praise be to Thee that Thou hast overcome sin, reconciled us with God, and made a way for us to eternal life. Honor and praise be to Thee also that after Thy resurrection Thou didst mercifully show Thyself to Thy disciples and friends, making glad their sorrowing hearts with exceeding comfort.

We beseech Thee, therefore, appear also unto us and all Christendom with peace and joy. Show us the print of the nails and Thy wounded side; and when we are slow of heart to believe, to know the Scriptures by Thy Holy Spirit, and grant us rightly rection. Help us to believe without doubting that Thou didst hide our iniquity in Thy grave, and for our benefit didst destroy death and the grim prison house, and didst truly rise and enter into Thy glory to make us partakers of the same, that as strangers and pilgrims on earth we may earnestly long for our eternal home and rest the hope of our blessed departure on Thee, the living Lord of Glory.

May we also, by the renewal of Thy Holy Spirit, rise daily from the servitude of sin and as Thy living members evermore delight in Thy service and praise.

Thou, O Lord, art the Strength of the weak and the Consolation of the afflicted. May we, therefore, not despair in the hour of trial, even though our eyes be holden for a time not to know Thee. Be Thou evermore our Companion upon the way and the Guest of our homes. Bless our daily bread. Grant peace unto our land and peace unto our souls, and preserve the joy and gladness of Easter continually in our hearts. When the day is far spent and the sun about to set, when the shadows thicken about us, in the gathering gloom of the eventide of life, in the agony and pain of death, graciously abide with us, and lead our souls out of this vale of sorrows into the heavenly Jerusalem. And on the last great day, when the voice of the archangel is heard, do Thou, O risen Lord, who art clothed with immortality and glory, raise up our mortal bodies and make them like unto Thy glorious body, and grant us peace everlasting in the mansions of heaven, where we shall see Thee face to face and where Thou wilt hold gracious converse with us and be our Joy and Pleasure, our Light and our Glory, world without end.

ASCENSION

O Lord Jesus Christ, Thou eternal Son of God, the Savior of the world, who, having finished the great work of redemption, didst triumphantly ascend into heaven and wast seated on the right hand of the Father, being exalted above all angels and principalities, and above all power and might, and above everything that is named in this world and in that which is to come, we worship and glorify Thee that Thy cross and Passion was concluded in rejoicing and through death Thou didst enter into Thine eternal glory and hast opened again the gates of Paradise for the children of men.

O Thou faithful Prophet, extend Thy Church, which Thou hast purchased with Thine own blood, and graciously keep us steadfast in Thy saving Word and the right use of the blessed Send forth faithful messengers of the Gospel, and clothe them with the armor of righteousness on the right hand and on the left, that all flesh may see Thy salvation. Govern the hearts of parents and teachers, that they may bring to Thee the children entrusted to their care, and do Thou lead those who are in the morning of their years upon the way of life. Awaken the unconverted, and raise the fallen, that they may no more cleave to the world, but lift up their eyes to the Land of Promise. Have mercy upon all who are in affliction and distress, in sickness and temptation; hear their cry, and refresh them with Thy heavenly comfort. And finally, when He shall come in majesty to judge the world in righteousness, grant, we beseech Thee, that with all the blessed we may inherit the Kingdom prepared for us and have our consummation and bliss in Thine eternal and everlasting glory; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

ALMIGHTY AND MOST MERCIFUL GOD, whose name is a strong tower, into which the righteous runneth and is safe, lift up the standard of Thy Spirit, we beseech Thee, against the power of the enemy, and clothe us with the full armor of righteousness on the right hand and on the left, that we may be able to fight manfully the good fight of faith, and so finish our course with joy, through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

ALMIGHTY AND MOST MERCIFUL GOD, our heavenly Father, we give Thee thanks that in the Sacrament of Holy Baptism Thou hast received us as Thy children and granted us, for Christ's sake, forgiveness of sin and everlasting life. So rule us, we beseech Thee, by Thy Holy Spirit that we may ever be mindful of our baptismal covenant, daily renounce every evil way, and serve Thee in true holiness, until we come at last into Thy heavenly kingdom, through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

LORD, our God, Thou Lover of mankind, we humbly beseech Thee, enlighten and instruct us by Thy Word in the true knowledge of Thee and of Thy will. Teach us Thy precepts and judgments, and let our hearts be occupied in Thy Law day and night. Confirm us in true faith, and number us with Thy flock. Clothe us with the garment of incorruption, cleanse us from all pollution of flesh and spirit, and let Thy Holy Spirit dwell in us, that all our coming in and going out may please Thee; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

O Lord God, by whom light is sown for the righteous and gladness for the upright in heart, illumine our hearts, we beseech Thee, with Thy heavenly grace, and fill them with the pure wisdom which cometh from above, that we may walk before Thee in simplicity and godly sincerity all our days, not taking counsel of the world or of the flesh, but aiming and endeavoring in all things only to know and do Thy will, through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

CHARITIES

LORD GOD, heavenly Father, who hast given unto Thy servants diversities of gifts, enriching us with the treasures of Thy kingdom, the means of grace, and the hope of salvation, and providing us richly and daily with all the necessities of life, so that we lacked not anything, we beseech Thee, make us truly thankful for Thine abundant mercies, and teach us that all our doings without charity are worth nothing. Let us not live unto ourselves in selfish enjoyment of Thy gifts, but rather unto Christ, who was dead and was raised again for us, and who said: By this shall all men know that ye are My disciples if ye have love one to another; Whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: Ye have the poor with you always, and whensoever ve will, ye may do them good; and, Give, and it shall be given unto you: for with the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again. Let us never forget Thy mercy, lest we forget to do good and to communicate; but let us rather account it a blessed privilege to render unto the poor the sacrifices with which Thou art well pleased, and which Thy beloved Son will account as done unto Himself.

Enable us more and more to fulfill this our duty with a pure heart from love to Thee and to our fellow men. Let us not seek honor and glory in this work; but when we do alms, let not the left hand know what the right hand doeth; neither let us regard this our service as a meritorious work, earning heaven for us; for when we shall have done all those things which are commanded us, we are but unprofitable servants, having done no more than was our duty to do. Let us give not only money, but love, giving sincerely and heartily, making sacrifices without regarding comfort or expecting returns. Help us to remember what a responsible duty is committed to our charge, rightly to divide and apportion those alms which have been entrusted to us among those in real necessity,

and give us grace to act wisely and faithfully. Help and prosper our work in the future as in the past. Enlarge the sphere of our operations to the alleviation of much bodily distress. In particular, grant that the needy may be also spiritually enriched, that, seeing our good works, they may learn to know Thee, to resign themselves willingly to Thy dispensation, to behold even misery transfigured by faith, and to praise Thee with us. May those that have pity on the poor remember that they have lent unto the Lord, and that He will repay them again. Let their prayers and alms come up for a memorial of their faith before Thee, and reward them plentifully with peace; through the merits of Jesus Christ, our only Savior.

HOME-FINDING, ORPHANAGE, CHILDREN'S FRIEND, FOUNDLING-HOME SOCIETY

O LORD GOD, who art the Father of the fatherless and the Judge of the widow and hast put it in our hearts to associate ourselves together for the purpose of providing for the bodily and spiritual welfare of waifs and orphan children [by placing them in Christian homes], we thank Thee for enabling us to engage in this work of mercy and love and for accompanying our labors in the past with signal blessings. And we beseech Thee, show us the work Thou hast for us to do, give us greater devotion and efficiency in the performance of it, and turn our humble endeavors into a means for the salvation of many and the glory of Thy great name. Let us be merciful, as Thou, our Father, art merciful. Teach us that it is pure religion and undefiled before Thee to visit the fatherless and the widows in their affliction. Recall frequently Suffer the little to our minds the words of Thy beloved Son: children to come unto Me, and: Whoso shall receive one such little child in My name receiveth Me. Help us to realize the bodily perils of unfortunate orphans and their still greater spiritual

dangers, if, though adopted into homes of means and comfort, they are not brought up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. Grant that, in obedience to Thy will and from sincere gratitude for the abundant blessings Thou givest us and our children daily to enjoy, we may regard the care of orphans as both a privilege and a duty. As our Master gave His life for us and for them, may we give bountifully of our means to relieve their bodily necessities and to have them instructed in the way of salvation, accounting it as our sole reward that the mouths of babes and sucklings do voice Thy praise. We beseech Thee also, Thou wouldst continue to prosper our work and to widen from day to day the sphere of our useful service. Fill many hearts with such love to Christ as will render them willing to open their hearts and homes to helpless fatherless children. [Remember those families that adopt our little wards; give them wisdom, patience, and forbearance for the difficult task of training aright children not their own flesh and blood, and perchance burdened with habits not easily overcome; and may theirs be a blessing as of having entertained angels unawares. Help the little ones to grow up in wisdom and favor with God and man, to be useful Christian men and women that delight in serving Thee.] Bless all Thy servants engaged in supporting and carrying on this charitable work. Bless the board of directors, the superintendent, the matron, [the teachers], and the nurses, that right counsels may everywhere prevail and right action follow. In all they do be Thou with them, and whatever difficulties, disappointments, or reproaches they may meet with, enable them in all things patiently to follow the example of Him who went about doing good. Make us all watchful and prayerful, that we may be ready when our Lord cometh to ask for an account of our stewardship, and let us never grow weary in well-doing, for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not. Hear us for the sake of Christ, Thy Son, the Friend of children.

HOME FOR THE AGED

Lord God, heavenly Father, who providest for all Thy children and hast said: Even to your old age I am He; and even to hoar hairs will I carry you: I have made, and I will bear; even I will carry, and will deliver you; and whose dear Son committed His mother to the disciple whom He loved, thereby showing us what to do for those who are left lonely in their advancing years, grant, we beseech Thee, that we may realize more and more fully that, as we are to honor the hoary head, so Thou wouldst have us as instruments of Thy mercy house and clothe and feed the aged, and that in so doing we are housing and clothing and feeding Christ, who will account that done unto the least of our brethren as done unto Himself.

And as by Thy guidance we have established here a Home for the Aged, dispose us to continue the good work by making us mindful of all the temporal and spiritual blessings we daily receive from Thee, and wherewith we are enabled to serve those whose strength faileth. Let us not grow forgetful of their various needs, but loving them as our own parents, diligently seek to provide them with sustenance for the body and every necessary convenience, and, above all things, with the Bread of Life, the Word of God.

Graciously preserve this Home from all calamities, that its residents may dwell securely therein, and make it for them a scene of pleasant companionships without envyings or strifes or animosities, that in quietness and contentment and godliness they may contemplate all Thy goodness, experienced by them in the years gone by, and cheerfully wait for the angel who is to bear them into the mansions of rest and peace and joy, the eternal home.

Raise up many new friends to this institution, and incline them to contribute generously toward its maintenance, that its usefulness may be extended and its blessings felt in ever-widening circles. Bestow upon those entrusted with the administration and management of the Home wisdom and faithfulness in their counsels and actions. And may all who by their support assist in its upbuilding learn that they are lending unto the Lord.

May we in all things perform our work in a manner pleasing to Thee. Let no worldly-mindedness enter into our charities, lest, in aiming to do good works, we defeat our faith, and even our greatest works become sins. Let us do all as in Thy presence, and after the example of Him who loved us and gave His life for us, that our work may please Thee; and hereafter receive us all into our eternal home with Thee in heaven, through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

HOSPITAL

O LORD JESUS CHRIST, Thou Sun of Righteousness with healing in Thy wings, our heavenly Physician, who with Thy stripes, by Thy innocent suffering and death, didst heal the wound of our sinful nature and obtain for us spiritual health; who also didst in mercy heal many that were afflicted with bodily ailments and daily givest to all of us life and health and all things, that as good stewards of the manifold grace of God we should minister Thy gifts one to another, we beseech Thee, give us a due sense of Thy manifold mercies, that, as we have received freely, we may freely give and by aiding those in affliction and distress may lead them to glorify with us Thy grace and never-failing help. And as Thou hast enabled us to erect a hospital in this place, grant that we may so conduct it as to provide the patients entrusted to us with the best bodily service, that their bodies may speedily be restored to health, but also with the right spiritual care, that their souls may be comforted and strengthened unto life and health everlasting. Fill our hearts with fervent love to Thee, that we may cheerfully and abundantly contribute of our substance for the maintenance and enlargement of the work we have undertaken

for Thy glory. Bless all the friends and supporters of this institution, and may they find that, having thrown their bread upon the waters, it will return to them after many days. Encompass and tempest and other calamities, that those within its walls may nurses here waiting on their calling, and enable those entrusted with the administration and management wisely and faithfully to past, and pray Thee for the days to come: Prosper the work of our hands for Thy glory and the good of many. Hear us for Thine own sake.

GRADUATION OF NURSES

O ETERNAL GOD, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who didst especially qualify women for services of helpfulness and mercy, and wouldst have them appear in the becoming adornment of good works, we beseech Thee to look upon these Thy servants. who, having experienced spiritual healing through the blood of the Lamb that was slain for us, would dedicate their strength for Thy praise to the service of the sick. Let them regard the calling which they have chosen, and for which they are so well suited, as an occupation involving faithful, diligent, conscientious, patient, and untiring labor and hardships, and offering a large opportunity of doing good. Let them labor from faith and love. Grant them true godliness, gentle forbearance, and patient endurance, that, in singleness of purpose and with a willing mind, realizing their grave responsibilities, they may worthily accomplish their difficult tasks. Let Thy Word continue to be a lamp unto their feet and a light unto their path. Protect them in the way wherein they are to go, sustain them in body and spirit, and bless their faithful labors, that those entrusted to their care may with Thy help by their ministrations be restored to health, and, seeing their faith and works, may be spiritually strengthened and glorify Thee, the works, in heaven, into whose hands we commit these Thy servants; for the sake of Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord.

HOME FOR THE FEEBLE-MINDED

O LORD JESUS CHRIST, our heavenly Friend, Teacher, and physician, who, loving all Thy creatures, gavest Thy life for the Physician, of all and wouldst have us to be fellow laborers with redemption to bring all men to the knowledge of the truth, we beseech Thee, awaken us to a realization of our duty toward all those who, lacking that clear and normal vision of mind which Thou hast vouchsafed to us, are dependent on our charity. As Thy praise is voiced by babes and sucklings, surely Thy grace is able to gain access also to the hearts of such unfortunates. Do Thou open our hearts and hands, that we may provide for them instruction in Thy Word and other useful knowledge in the measure of their ability. Especially, we beseech Thee, let us remember those entrusted to our care in this Home, and enable us so to perform our duty by these our wards as we shall desire to have done in the day of accounting. Bless the business administration of our Home. and grant to this Christian undertaking permanence and success. Bless our teachers and give them skill and patience and power. Bless Thy Word that, though other knowledge fail to take root, Thy Gospel may be the seed unto eternal life, when the cloud shall be lifted and these feeble ones shall stand with us before Thy throne and glorify Thee forever. Bless the Home and all its friends, that it may be a cause of rejoicing to many and of thanking Thee, who art pleased to prosper the work of our hands; and teach us to do the good work in such manner as will surely please Thee. Lift from our minds more and more the dark cloud of sin, enlighten us by Thy Spirit, be Thou, O Sun of Righteousness, our light and life, lead us upon the way, and finally receive us into our home in glory.

FOR THE DEAF

LORD, our God, Thou hast made the eye, and wilt Thou not see? Thou hast made the ear, and wilt Thou not hear the supplications of Thy people who cry unto Thee in Jesus' name? We pray Thee, look in pity on all sorts and conditions of men, and in tender mercy regard all those who are called to suffer affliction, especially also the deaf.

Thou hast promised and sent Thy Son Jesus Christ that the ears of the deaf should be unstopped, that the tongue of the dumb should speak, and that the poor should have the Gospel preached unto them. We thank Thee that Thou hast caused Thy precious Gospel to be brought and interpreted also to the deaf, making it a word to pass from the eye to the heart. Accompany, we beseech Thee, with Thy heavenly benediction the preaching of Thy Truth to the deaf, and let them experience Thy saving health and the rich comfort of Thy grace in Christ Jesus. Let the heavens be opened, as in the day when Thy beloved Son prayed for the deaf, and send forth Thy Holy Spirit, that by His gracious ministration they may perceive the things that pertain to their salvation.

Bless the endeavors of all whom Thou hast entrusted with the care and instruction of the deaf. Grant them patience and skill. Give us all a due sense of Thy manifold mercies, and fill our hearts with fervent love, that, even as Thou, heavenly Father, art merciful, we may show mercy by aiding those who are in affliction and need. Grant that we may never abuse the precious faculty of hearing by giving ear to profane and idle babblings of men or the pernicious lies of Satan, but make us more ready to hear Thy Word and to keep it in good and honest hearts, that it may bring forth fruit an hundredfold.

Look in pity on all, who, having ears, do not hear, and open

their ears and their hearts that they may be converted to know Their the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom Thou hast sent. We ask it in the name of Jesus Christ, who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end.

FOR THE BLIND

O BLESSED LORD JESUS CHRIST, who by Thine unspeakable sufferings and death hast delivered all men from the darkness of sin and death, we thank Thee that Thou hast revealed Thyself as the true Light which lighteth every man that cometh into the world. O Thou Sun of Righteousness, who during Thine earthly ministry didst open the eyes of the blind to behold Thy glory, continue, we pray Thee, Thy merciful ministrations to all those whose earthly paths are shrouded in darkness. O Thou Light of the world. be Thou a lamp unto their feet and a light unto their path, that they, beholding Thee with the eyes of faith, may never walk in the darkness of unbelief and despair. Richly prosper the preaching of Thy Word among the blind, that, though their eyes be sightless, they may by Thy Gospel clearly see Thee as their only Savior and Redeemer and humbly serve Thee in this life in true faith; and when life's day is done, may they see Thee in Thy glory, where there shall be no more darkness, but fullness of light forevermore. Hear us for Thy name's sake. Amen.

GENERAL RUBRICS

These General Rubrics together with the Rubrics given in the Services are a directory to the pastor for the conduct of divine worship

I. FOR THE ORDER OF MORNING SERVICE, THE ORDER OF THE HOLY COMMUNION, THE ORDER OF MATINS, THE ORDER OF VESPERS

When the Officiant stands before the altar, he faces the altar for all sacrificial acts and the Congregation for all sacramental acts.

The sacrificial acts of the Morning Service and of the Order of the Holy Communion are the Trinitarian Invocation, the Confession, the Introit. the Hymns and Canticles, the Gradual, the Creed, the Prayers, the Offertory, the Preface, the Sanctus, and the Words of Institution; in the Order of Matins: the Hymns, the Opening Versicles, the Psalmody, the Versicle after the Lection, the Canticles, and the Prayers; in the Order of Vespers: the Hymns, the Opening Versicles, the Psalmody, the Versicle after the Lection and the Versicle after the Office Hymn, the Canticles, and the Prayers.

The sacramental acts of the Morning Service and of the Order of the Holy Communion are the Invitation to Confession, the Declaration of Grace, or the Absolution, the Salutation, the Lessons, the Sermon, the Votum, the Salutation, the Benedicamus, and the Benediction; in the

Order of Matins: the Invitatory, the Lection, the Sermon, the Salutation, the Benedicamus, and the Benediction; in the Order of Vespers: the Lection, the Sermon, the Salutation, the Benedicamus, and the Benediction.

The word "shall" in the Rubrics makes that part of the Service obligatory, while the word "may" leaves it optional.

When turning at the altar, the Officiant shall ordinarily turn by his right side to face the Congregation and by his left side to face the altar.

Whenever Holy Communion is celebrated in a Church Service, the Order of the Holy Communion shall be used in its entirety.

The Propria, or Propers (as distinguished from the fixed portions of the Service, called the Ordinary), that is, the Introit, the Collect, the Epistle, the Gradual, and the Gospel for the Day, shall be used throughout the week following, except on those Days for which other appointments are made.

Christmas, Easter, Pentecost, and

Trinity Sunday are designated as the Feasts of the Church Year; all other Festival Days are designated as the Festivals of the Church Year.

THE COLLECTS

The Collect for Ash Wednesday is said in every Lenten Service after the Collect for the Day.

Whenever the Collect for the Day is said, the full termination as appointed shall be used. If other Collects are said after it, as at Matins and Vespers, the full termination shall be used with the Collect for the Day and the last Collect only. The last Collect in Matins is the Collect for Grace, the last in Vespers the Collect for Peace.

The short termination of the Collects used after the Collect for the Day will usually be: through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord; or: through the same Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord. Exceptions to this rule will be found printed in full in the texts of the Additional Collects.

When the Petition is addressed to God the Father, the full termination is: through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end.

When the Petition is addressed to God the Son, the termination is: who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end.

When the Petition is addressed to God the Holy Ghost, the termination is: who livest and reignest with the Father and the Son, ever one God, world without end.

When mention is made of our Lord in the body of the Petition, the termination is: through the same Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end.

When mention is made of our Lord at the end of the Petition, the termination is: who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end.

When mention is made of the Holy Ghost in the body of the Collect, the termination is: who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the same Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end.

When the Petition is addressed to God the Holy Trinity, the termination is: who livest and reignest, ever one God, world without end.

THE MUSIC

The music of the Service is not a part of the Liturgy and may be altered as circumstances permit or require.

Liturgical chant, more so than any other type of church music, is not a musical interpretation of the text; it is only the bearer of the text and hence should be sung in a simple, straightforward manner. The Officiant shall chant those portions of the Service to which the Choir or the Congregation responds with chanting.

The primary function of the Choir is to lead the Congregation in the singing of the Liturgy and the Hymns, and to sing the Propers of the Liturgy when they are beyond the capacity of the Congregation.

In view of the fact that the music presented by the Choir and organist is part of the Service of Worship, it is imperative that this music be in keeping with the spirit of the liturgical character of the Service.

From time to time the Choir may sing parts of the Ordinary in more elaborate choral settings.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Notices to the Congregation, except in connection with requests for Intercession, ought not to be read during the Services.

HOLY BAPTISM

Unless otherwise ordered in a Congregation, public Baptism may be administered after the Opening Hymn, in which case the Opening Hymn may well be a baptismal hymn.

MIDWEEK EVENING SERVICES

The Order of Vespers may be used for midweek evening Services. In place of the Lection during Lent, a portion of the History of our Lord's Passion may be read.

II. THE ORDER OF MORNING SERVICE AND THE ORDER OF THE HOLY COMMUNION

THE PREPARATORY SERVICE

For the Invocation and the Preparatory Service the Officiant may stand at the foot of the altar steps, advancing to the altar at the Introit.

When the Service begins with the Introit, the Officiant shall proceed to the altar at once.

Since the Preparation is not a part of the Service proper, it is preferable

that the Officiant and the Congregation speak the entire Preparatory Service. The Congregation may kneel until the Declaration of Grace has been spoken.

THE INTROIT

The Introit for the Day with the Gloria Patri should be sung by the Choir. If a Choir is not available,

the Introit may be said or chanted by the Officiant; in this case the Gloria Patri may be said or sung by the Congregation.

The Introit for the Day, including the Gloria Patri, should either be sung or spoken throughout.

The Antiphon, which announces the keynote of the Introit, shall be repeated after the Gloria Patri.

If the Confessional Service immediately precedes the Communion Service, the latter shall begin with the Introit.

THE KYRIE

The Kyrie shall be said or sung by the Congregation.

A ninefold, but not a fourfold or sixfold (the Officiant speaking the first line; the Officiant speaking each line) Kyrie may be substituted for the threefold Kyrie. In place of the English text, the Greek form, "Kyrie Eleison, Christe Eleison, Kyrie Eleison," may be used in either a threefold or a ninefold form.

THE GLORIA IN EXCELSIS

The Gloria in Excelsis shall be used on all Feast and Festival Days; at other times a versified form of the Gloria in Excelsis (Hymns 237, 238, in *The Lutheran Hymnal*), or another hymn of praise, may be used. The Gloria in Excelsis shall also be used at all services of Worship in which the Administration of Holy

Communion takes place, except that in this case it may be omitted during the Seasons of Advent, Pre-Lent, and Lent.

THE LESSONS

Before the Epistle for the Day an appointed Lesson from the Old Testament (cf. pp. 438, 439) may be read, but the Epistle for the Day and the Gospel for the Day shall always be read.

When the Minister announces the Gospel for the Day, the Congregation shall rise and then chant, Glory be to Thee. O Lord.

THE GRADUAL FOR THE DAY AND THE HALLELUJAH

The Gradual for the Day or the Sentence for the Season should be sung by the Choir. If a choir is not available, the Officiant may say the Gradual or the Sentence for the Season; or the Congregation may simply sing the Hallelujah after the Epistle has been read. Hallelujah is not sung during Pre-Lent and Lent.

Special choir music may be sung in place of, or preferably in addition to, the Gradual, between the Epistle and the Gospel. When this is done, it is important that the textual content of the choral selection harmonize with the theme of the Liturgy and Service. A hymn of Invocation to the Holy Ghost may be sung to replace the Gradual; the classical Gradual

Hymn of the Lutheran Church is "We Now Implore God the Holy Ghost" (The Lutheran Hymnal, Hymn 231).

THE CREED

The Nicene Creed shall be chanted or said by the Congregation on all Feasts and Festivals and whenever there is a Communion; at other times the Apostles' Creed may be used in its stead, or a versified form of these Creeds may be sung. Cf. Hymns 251, 252, 253, in The Lutheran Hymnal.

On Trinity Sunday, the Athanasian Creed may be used after the Gradual.

THE VOTUM

When saying the Votum at the close of the Sermon, the Preacher may raise his hand in blessing and make the sign of the cross.

THE GENERAL PRAYER

Before the General Prayer at the altar the Officiant may announce special Petitions, Intercessions, or Thanksgivings which have been requested. He may also make mention of the birth, contemplated marriage, death, etc., of members of the Congregation.

One of the General Prayers appointed for the Services shall always be used. The Litany may be used instead of the General Prayer, except when there is a Communion.

THE HOLY COMMUNION

The Celebrant may make ready the Communion vessels immediately after the Offertory.

If there be another Minister to assist in the Distribution, he may approach the altar during the singing of the Agnus Dei.

THE PROPER PREFACE

The Proper Preface shall be used throughout its respective Season. The Preface of the Holy Trinity may be used on any Sunday for which no other Preface is appointed.

THE SACRED ELEMENTS

In making ready the elements for the Holy Communion, so much of the bread and the wine shall be placed in the proper vessels as in the judgment of the Celebrant will be required for the Administration.

If the consecrated bread or wine be spent before all have communed, the Celebrant shall consecrate more, saying aloud so much of the Words of Institution as pertains to the element to be consecrated.

When all have received the Holy Sacrament, the Celebrant shall cover what remains of the bread and wine with the veil.

When the Service has been completed, the Celebrant or a deacon shall remove the sacramental vessels from the altar to the sacristy and dispose of that part of the bread and wine which remains as follows: He shall carefully remove the bread from the paten and ciborium to a fit receptacle, there to be kept against the next Communion.

He shall pour what remains of the consecrated wine into the piscina or upon the ground at a proper and convenient place outside the church.

III. THE ORDER OF MATINS

THE INVITATORY

The Invitatory always precedes the Venite, Psalm 95. It varies with the Season. See pages 216—224. Other appropriate Invitatories may be used.

After the Venite and the Gloria Patri the whole Invitatory shall be repeated.

THE PSALM

In the reading or chanting of the Psalter at Matins, Psalm 95 (Venite) shall not be used.

On Trinity Sunday, the Athanasian Creed may replace a Psalm.

THE ANTIPHON

An Antiphon may be said or chanted with each Psalm.

When an Antiphon is used with the Psalm, it shall be chanted before the Psalm and repeated after the Gloria Patri.

THE LECTION

One Lesson shall, more may, be read. On Sundays or Festivals one Lesson shall be read from the

Epistles and one from the Gospels. A Lesson from the Old Testament may precede the Lesson from the Epistles. See page 438. Lessons shall not be chosen from the Psalter.

The Epistle and the Gospel for the Day shall not be used as Lessons at Matins.

In announcing the Lesson the Officiant shall say: The First (or Second or Third) Lesson is written in the —— chapter of —— beginning at the —— verse. The Lesson ended, he shall say: Here endeth the First (or Second or Third) Lesson. After that, facing the altar, he may say or chant: But Thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us.

THE RESPONSORY

The Responsory varies with the Season and may be sung by the Choir after the last Lesson. See pages 216 to 227. Other appropriate Responsories may also be used.

THE SERMON

The Sermon or Address may follow the Lesson and Responsory as appointed.

MATIN CANTICLES

The Te Deum. Proper at Matins on all Sundays except in Advent and on an Septuagesima to Good Friday; also proper on Feasts and Festivals and during their Seasons.

The Benedictus. Proper on all Sundays in Advent and from Septuagesima to Good Friday; also proper for daily use.

The Benedicite. Proper on Feasts and Festivals and during Eastertide, when the Te Deum is not used. See page 282.

The Dignus Est Agnus. Proper during Eastertide and Ascensiontide. May also be used during the Trinity Season. See page 289.

The Beatitudes. Proper during Trinity Season, but may be used any other time except Sundays. See page 288.

Any of the other Canticles, except the Magnificat and the Nunc Dimittis, may be used at Matins on any Day except a Sunday or a Feast or a Festival. See page 282. Confite-

bor Tibi is traditionally associated with Monday, Ego dixi with Tuesday, Exultavit cor meum with Wednesday, Cantemus Domino with Thursday, Domine audivi with Friday, and Audite coeli with Saturday.

An Antiphon may be sung with any of the Canticles except the Te Deum. It should be sung before the Canticle and repeated after the Canticle by the entire Choir. See pages 216-227.

THE PRAYERS

Instead of the Prayers appointed, the Suffrages, the Litany, or other Prayers may be used. The Bidding Prayer may be used in the same manner on any Wednesday or Friday in Lent and on Good Friday.

THE COLLECT

The Collect for the Sunday is ordinarily said at Matins throughout the week. The Collect for Grace shall be the last Collect used at Matins. A Versicle may be used before any Collect after the first.

IV. THE ORDER OF VESPERS

THE ANTIPHON

An Antiphon may be said or chanted with each Psalm. When an Antiphon is used with

a Psalm, it shall be sung before the Psalm and repeated after the Gloria Patri by the entire Choir. The Psalm is sung to the tone of the Antiphon.

THE LECTION

One or more Lessons from the Old or the New Testament shall be read. See page 422.

The Epistle and the Gospel for the Day shall not be used as Lessons at Vespers.

In announcing the Lesson the Officiant shall say: The First (or Second or Third) Lesson is written in the —— chapter of —— beginning at the —— verse. The Lesson ended, he shall say: Here endeth the First (or Second or Third) Lesson. After that, facing the altar, he may say or chant: But Thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us.

THE RESPONSORY

The Responsory varies with the Season and may be sung by the Choir after the last Lesson. See pages 216 to 227. Other appropriate Responsories may also be used.

THE SERMON

The Sermon or Address may follow the Lesson and Responsory as appointed.

VESPER CANTICLES

The Magnificat. The proper Canticle at Vespers at all times.

The Nunc Dimittis. A proper substitute for the Magnificat only when Vespers are said or sung as a late Office.

The Dignus Est Agnus. Proper during Eastertide and Ascensiontide. May also be used during the Trinity Season. See page 289.

On Festivals a special Versicle, see pages 216—229, may be used before the Canticle.

An Antiphon may be sung with the Canticle. See page 216.

THE PRAYER

Instead of the Prayer appointed, the Suffrages or the Litany or other Prayers may be said.

THE COLLECT

The Collect for the Sunday is ordinarily said at Vespers throughout the week until Friday; but on Saturday the Collect for the following Sunday is said. The Collect proper for any Festival may be used at Vespers of the day before. The Collect for Peace shall be the last Collect in the Order of Vespers. A Versicle may be used before any Collect after the first.

V. MISCELLANEOUS

Red:

THE LITURGICAL COLORS The Liturgical colors are white, red, green, violet, and black. Their

significance is as follows:

Color of the Godhead. White:

eternity, robe of the glorified Christ and the Angels,

perfection, joy, purity.

Color of fire, fervor, blood. Red:

martyrdom, love, victorious truth of Christian

teaching based on the

blood and righteousness of

Christ.

Color of abiding life. Green:

nourishment, rest: domi-

nant color in nature.

Violet: Color of royal mourning

and repentance.

Black: Absence of color, symbol-

ical of death.

THEIR PROPER USE

White: From and with Vespers of

Eve of Nativity through the Epiphany Octave.

On Maundy Thursday,

when Communion is cele-

brated.

From and with the Vespers of Easter Eve through to the Vespers of the Eve of Whitsunday.

On the Feast of the Holy Trinity and during its Octave.

All the other Festivals of Christ, i. e., Presentation, Annunciation, Visitation, and Transfiguration. On the Day of St. Michael and All Angels. On the day of the Conversion of St. Paul; the Nativity of St. John the Baptist; All Saints' Day; the Dedication of a Church and Its Anniversary; on days of general or special thanksgiving and on the festivals of saints not martyrs.

From and with the Vespers on the Eve of Whitsunday through to the Vespers on the Eve of Holy Trinity.

The Festival of the Reformation and its Octave.

On commemorating the

death of martyrs.

Green:

From and with Matins on January 14 to Vespers of the Eve of Septuagesima. From the Second Sunday after Trinity through the Trinity Season to the Vespers on the Eve of Advent.

Violet:

From and with the Vespers on the Eve of Advent to the Vespers on the Eve of the Nativity.

From and with Vespers on the Saturday before Septuagesima and throughout Pre-Lent and Lent, to Vespers on the Eve of Easter.

For the Day of Humiliation.

Black:

For Good Friday only.

Variants:

In some parts of the Lutheran Church green is used from Septuagesima through Shrove Tuesday. In that case white should be used from Matins on January 14 until, but not at, Vespers on the Saturday before Septuagesima. Violet may be used from Matins on the Monday after Rogation Sunday until, but not at, Vespers on the Wednesday before the

Ascension Day, and on Holy Innocents' Day when it falls during the week.

The Solemnization of Holy Matrimony and the Order for the Burial of the Dead shall not affect the proper color for the Day or Season in use when these Services are held.

THE ALTAR LINENS

The Fair Linen, a cloth covering the altar, extending one third or two thirds or all the way to the floor at the narrow ends, shall always be upon the altar.

THE SACRAMENTAL LINENS

The Corporal, a square of very fine linen, is laid on the center of the Fair Linen cloth. Upon it the sacramental vessels are placed.

The Pall, a small square of stiff material covered or lined with linen, is used to cover the chalice. It should be removed at the Consecration.

The Purificators, squares of heavy linen, are used to cleanse the rim of the chalice during the Administration.

The Veil, made of silk or of the finest linen, is used to cover the sacramental vessels upon the altar or credence table. It is removed before the Preface and should be folded carefully and laid upon the altar and again

placed over the sacramental vessels after the Administration at the Nunc Dimittis.

When not in use on the altar, the sacramental linens should be properly folded and kept in the Burse, a square envelope made of strong cardboard, covered with silk or heavy linen.

HEADGEAR FOR WOMEN

It is a laudable custom, based upon a Scriptural injunction (1 Cor. 11:

3-15), for women to wear an appropriate head covering in Church, especially at the time of divine service.

On and after Easter Day, 1955, in any case of a contradiction between these General Rubrics as they are here printed and other rubrics published elsewhere in the official service books of the Evangelical Lutheran Synodical Conference of North America, these General Rubrics shall govern.

THE MOVABLE FEASTS AND FESTIVALS OF THE CHURCH YEAR

The Movable Feasts and Festivals all depend upon Easter, except Advent.

Advent Sunday is always the nearest Sunday to the thirtieth day of November, whether before or after. Easter is always the first Sunday after the Full Moon which happens upon or next after the twenty-first day of March; and if the Full Moon happens upon a Sunday, Easter is the Sunday after. The time of Easter being found, the other Feasts and Festivals occur as follows:

Septuagesima Sunday is nine weeks before Easter. Ash Wednesday, or the beginning of Lent, is forty-six days before Easter. Palmarum, or the beginning of Holy Week, is seven days before Easter. Maundy Thursday is the Thursday before Easter. Good Friday is the Friday before Easter. Ascension Day is forty days after Easter. Whitsunday is seven weeks after Easter. Trinity Sunday is eight weeks after Easter.
